
Do you know a potential Rotary Global Grant Scholar?

ROTARY POST GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

VALUE: UP TO \$US 60,000

Rotary District 9800 has designed a targeted Post Graduate Scholarship to focus on overseas study for a Masters degree, to a value of up to US\$60,000.

The Scholarship is designed to enhance the profiles of our best graduates in recent years and acknowledges the underlying strength of Victorian University graduates. The field of study must fit one of the Rotary Foundation's 6 Areas of Focus.

Applicants are invited from persons normally resident in Victoria and must be made through a Victorian Rotary Club. Lineal descendents of current/ recent Rotarians are ineligible.

Applicants must be eligible for Global Grants which are awarded through a globally competitive process.

The Scholarship is more flexible than the previously offered Ambassadorial Scholarship in that scholars select their university while the time lines between selection and commencing study can be much shorter.

Applications close mid-March 2018
